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GENERAL GUIDELINES

ATTENDANCE

While attendance is not required, it is recommended. Our ministries are designed to build upon each age level. We know that a child's faith is strongly influenced by what his or her parents encourage and hold in high esteem. With this knowledge, we would like to work with you and your family in developing children and youth to fall deeply in love with Jesus Christ.

WORSHIP WITH LITTLE ONES

It's Sunday morning, one minute before church starts. You just parked the car, unbuckled the children, grabbed the diaper bag that spilled under the seats, then checked to see if any of your little ones are running across the parking lot. They are. So you gather up your things and run after them while holding the baby all the while hoping no one from church notices. Phew! You finally made it to the sanctuary during the first song. The circus has just begun.

Let us reassure you that you are doing the right thing. If you value worship, you need to expose your children from an early age, so they will value it too. Children don't learn how to sit in church, listen during the sermon, and stand for prayer if they never experience it. The 'bad' news is that while you are teaching them that church is important (and it is!) you may not be able to experience worship as you have in the past. This faith education is very important, so be willing to give up some of your comfort in order to build a foundation for your children.

There are some things you can do with your children that will help them stay in church and not be too distracted or too distracting to others. You may even be able to listen to the sermon for a while!

- *Bring a Worship Bag filled with quiet items that your children like. Place Christian books, soft toys, non-messy crackers, or quiet games in the bag. It's also ok to bring a blanket to let the smaller children get comfortable or to nap.*
- *Sit closer to the front. Sitting up front helps the children see what's happening, focusing on worship and reducing distractions.*
- *Don't be afraid to ask for help from those around you. Everyone understands children make noise. Those around you will appreciate that you are teaching your children the value of worship.*

More importantly, you will teach and model for your children the value of worship. That knowledge, that training, will last them a lifetime. Proverbs 22:6 states, "Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it." Worship is what we were created to do. To honor God all day long with songs of praise and adoration for He who created us into existence. We look to you, as parents, to instill this in your young children. We look to you to pray every day with your student, have discussions about God and what He has done in your day, turn the car radio to Christian music, or whatever other creative ways you find to worship God.

1. The Reason behind Roots

In Ephesians 3:14-19 Paul prays:

¹⁴ For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, ¹⁵ from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named, ¹⁶ that according to the riches of his glory he may grant you to be strengthened with power through his Spirit in your inner being, ¹⁷ so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith—that you, being rooted and grounded in love, ¹⁸ may have strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, ¹⁹ and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.

Within this prayer, one key concept serves as a foundation to the rest...being rooted and established in love. The children's ministries at Christ Lutheran Church carry the name Roots because with every event, decision, or prayer for the children, it is our desire to deepen the roots of love in our children and parents. The prayer for the Ephesians that Paul prayed represents the same prayer that the Roots Coordinating Team prays for the children of Christ Lutheran Church!

Roots Children Ministries desire to empower and stand alongside parents in their calling to

family, knowing that parents are the most influential Christian models in their child's life. There will be several opportunities for parents to grow in their faith alongside their children, as detailed in the rest of this handbook.

2. Sunday Roots Jr. [3-5 year olds]: 9:30-10:30 AM

In Sunday Roots Jr., we use a large group/small group format to root children in the Scripture. In the small group portion, shepherds teach the children through circle time and various activities which relate to their large group experience. In large group, the children will learn through drama, activities, puppet skits, and worship. Below are listed some of the details you need to know about Sunday Roots Jr.:

- **Parent Cue App and Take Home Card:** Every month, we experience a new theme that serves to teach us and guide us in God's Word. Once per month you will get a laminated placemat that goes right along with the theme for the month. Each week, your child will have an activity card they bring home. The best way to stay up on what is going on in Roots Jr. is to download the Parent Cue App from Google Play and the App Store. The devotions found in the App are the same devotions we send home with your children.
- **Age Requirement:** Children must turn 3 by August 31st, 2019 to attend the 3 year old classes.
- **3 Year Old Blessing:** We welcome your children into Sunday Roots Jr. with this special blessing event! Happening on September 15, 22, 29 during Sunday Roots, we will be holding parent/child classes for three weeks. During these three weeks, you will learn how to effectively train your child in the faith, how to be God's representative to your child, and prayerfully create your own blessing to pray over your child. These blessings will be prayed over them on October 6th at the 10:45am service in a special blessing event, where your child will receive a Jesus Storybook Bible.

3. Wednesday Roots Jr. [3-5 year olds]: 6-7:30 PM

Wednesday Roots Jr. is open to all families from Christ Lutheran and our surrounding community. Parents are encouraged and invited to serve on the Wednesday Roots Jr. team. We have volunteers serve in "up front" leader roles as well as "behind the scenes" roles.

Children must turn 3 by August 31st, 2019 to attend the 3 year old classes. This ministry is structured as a small group event, during which circle time and activity time are designed to root the children in Scripture. Also during Wednesday Roots Jr., the children participate in worship time.

4. Sunday Roots [Kindergarten-4th Grade]: 9:30-10:30 AM

Sunday Roots utilizes a large group/small group format. In large group, children learn the Scripture for the week through dramas, videos, worship, and lessons from the large group leader. Following large group time, the children travel down the hallway to their classrooms, where they meet in small groups with their grade level. During small group time, we emphasize building relationships between the shepherds and the students. In these settings, the small groups will participate in activities, crafts, memory work, and discussions that will help them to apply the Scripture to their lives.

Below are listed some of the details you need to know about Sunday Roots Jr.:

- ***Parent Cue App and Take Home Card:*** Every month, we experience a new theme that serves to teach us and guide us in God's Word. Each week, your child will have an activity card they bring home. The best way to stay up on what is going on in Roots Jr. is to download the Parent Cue App from Google Play and the App Store. The devotions found in the App are the same devotions we send home with your children.
- ***Have your children bring their Bibles to class every week.***
- ***3rd Grade Bible Class:*** In this 3 week parent/child class, happening on September 25, October 2, and October 9, your child will receive his/her first word-for-word translation of the Bible. In these sessions, he/she will learn how the Bible is organized, how to look up verses, and the importance of understanding God's promise of salvation found in Jesus Christ. On Sunday, October 13 at the 10:45 service, there will be a special blessing event, where your child will be prayed over and blessed to continue in the knowledge of the Word.

5. Wednesday Roots [Kindergarten-4th Grade]: 6-7:30 PM

Wednesday Roots is open to all families from Christ Lutheran and our surrounding community. Parents are encouraged and invited to serve on the Wednesday Roots team. We have volunteers serve in "up front" leader roles as well as "behind the scenes" roles.

Wednesday Roots is geared to enhance the Sunday experience, but also stands on its own to teach the Bible stories with a monthly theme and weekly Life App (application), which drive the Gospel message deep into the lives of our children. The night consists of fun activities, games, crafts, and stories designed to help our children better understand God's love in Christ Jesus.

6. Vacation Bible School 2019

The dates for this coming **Vacation Bible School** are **June 15-19, 2020** from 9am-Noon

Key dates for VBS include:

- **VBS Kickoff:** April 5 during Sunday school. Come join us in kicking off our opportunity to bring our VBS to the community around us. Get key information about the upcoming VBS.
- **VBS Registration will open April 5**, and we will make a big outreach push at this point in time.
- **VBS Ministry Partner Training Event** – June 7
- **June 15th – 19th from 9am-noon:** Come join us in celebrating what Christ has done for us, and help teach children about that love.

7. Roots Kid 2 Kid Offerings

At every Roots Sunday and Wednesday meeting, we will collect an offering for Community 4 Kids. The funds from these offerings will go toward purchasing food items to go into our food packs, which will be packed on October 16th and March 25th. We will hold a challenge to see how many food packs we can provide throughout the year, which you will hear about starting on September 8th.

Community 4 Kids is a non-profit ministry to the hungry kids and families of the Blue Valley School District. Participating alongside this ministry allows our kids in Roots to realize they can make an impact for the Kingdom by giving an offering.

10. Parent Cue App and Facebook

What happens at home is even more powerful than what happens here at Roots. The average Sunday school worker has 40 hours per year to influence their students in the faith, but the average parent has 3,000 hours! That is why we have made more efforts to get powerful tools in your hands, beginning with the Parent Cue App and Facebook group. Here is how it will work:

- Download the Parent Cue App on Google Play or the App Store and keep up to date with what your children are learning in Sunday/Wednesday Roots. There are fun activities for drive time, bed time, meal time, and other fun resources to keep your child's attention focused on God's love and promises they are experiencing each week.
- Facebook: Connect with our children's ministry Facebook page. Search for Roots Children's Ministries: Christ Lutheran Church on Facebook. Join our group and get constant updates on all the happenings and great articles about parenting.

11. Parents as Partners

We always welcome parent involvement in any Roots or Roots Jr. meeting. Please take the opportunity to participate in what your children do at Christ Lutheran. Your involvement in your child's faith walk is not just encouraged, it is vital to your child as seen in Deuteronomy 6:4-7.

⁴ "Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one.^[a] ⁵ You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. ⁶ And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. ⁷ You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise.

We have a few ways parents can get involved listed below:

- **Always looking for Ministry Partners!** Please consider offering your time and talents to either Sundays or Wednesdays. We always welcome new people into our community of shepherds, large group storytellers, tech people, hosts, and supply team members.

Finally, always pray for opportunities to arise that will allow for you to guide your children in the faith. He is faithful to bring these opportunities, and we see this especially when we are tuned to what the Holy Spirit is doing in our children's lives.

13. Drop off/Pick up Procedures and Other Safety Items

At Roots and Roots Jr. we will only allow a child to leave with an authorized adult who has a matching security code. We will not allow siblings to pick up the students, as that can create some confusion. Following are the drop off/pick up procedures for Sundays and Wednesdays:

- Check your child in at one of the check in computer stations. Your child will receive a nametag. Parents will receive a stub with a security code that must be matched to your child's nametag at pickup.

- **Youth Protection Policy** - All ministry partners will be trained in our Youth Protection Policy, and will undergo a background check to ensure the environment is safe for our children. - **Allergies** – We work to ensure that our environment is safe for those with life-threatening allergies. Consequently, we only use snacks from a list of items that are peanut and tree nut free. - **CPR Certification** – We ensure that there is always a CPR Certified person nearby in case of emergency. If there are special needs or circumstances that we need to be aware of, please contact Katie Morgan and we will make sure to accommodate that need.

1. Sunday Morning Classes

Sunday classes begin September 8th. Classes meet from 9:30-10:30 AM. Bring your Bible, pen and a notebook! Students will learn what we believe, teach and confess as Lutherans based on the teachings of Martin Luther as found in Luther's Small Catechism. Class will include time in the Word, prayer, and time for fun as well!

2. Wednesday Night Small Groups

They will apply what they learn to real-life situations and address the overall question, "Now what?" Youth will be engaged with their small group allowing them time to build relationships with one another and discuss how to apply Biblical truth in practical ways to their lives.

5. Middle School Praise Time

7. Lock-ins and Retreats

Confirmation at Christ Lutheran (8th Grade)

The confirmation program for 8th-grade students has three objectives:

1. Foster an individual, relevant relationship between the student and Jesus Christ that he or she can profess and begin modeling in daily life.
2. Ensure that students understand the teachings and beliefs of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod.
3. Transition the 8th-grade student into the High School program and beyond.

- **Fall Schedule:**

- **Confirmation Classes and Test:** Confirmation classes are held on Sunday mornings in during the fall semester in the Library from 9:30-10:30 am. Korey Danley and staff teach the class, which focuses on Lutheran doctrine. Students should bring a bible, notebook, and pencil to take notes. Students will be required to score 85% or higher on a written test held in December. A retest will be given for all students who do not achieve 85% on the test. In the spring, 8th graders move into the high school class on Sunday mornings.
- **Small groups at Mentor Couple homes, Wednesdays, 6:15-7:45 pm.** Students meet in small group (6-8 kids) in the homes of adult Mentor Couples to apply what they learned on Sunday mornings in real-life situations. Every year, students look back on their experiences with Mentor Couples as a highlight of the Confirmation program. In spring, 8th graders will join together at church on Wednesday nights from 6-7:30 for a bible-based DVD session and group discussion.

- **Spring Schedule:**

- **Sunday Morning Small Groups:** Youth Room 9:30-10:30 AM
- **Wednesday Evening 8th Grade Study:** Youth Room 6-7:30 PM

- **Confirmation:**

- **“What Jesus Means to Me” speeches and Rite of Confirmation:** All students will be required to make a public declaration of their faith and lifelong pledge to follow Jesus Christ during a Saturday night service. Students will then affirm their baptism through confirmation that same evening. The speeches and Rite of Confirmation happen Saturday May 2nd.
